The objectives and points for discussion in this scheme should be **planned in to PSHCE / ICT** teaching in particular, but can be addressed in any area in which they are appropriate. More **regular** discussion of the issues will enable children to have a **safe and responsible** attitude towards the use of new technologies.

Key Objectives

Web Browsing

- I know what to do if I find something that upsets me online
- I can make judgements about the reliability of a website
- I can make judgements about the suitability of a website
- I know what information I should give about myself when completing website forms
- I know what to do if I am asked to install software from a website
- I understand the importance of keeping passwords secure

Online Publishing

- I know that copying text or images from other sources and publishing it online is illegal
- I know that what I publish online is visible by the world, so quality and accuracy are important.

Instant Messaging

- I can make judgements about who to chat to using instant messaging
- I consider how my messages will make other people feel
- I know what to do if I receive a nasty or upsetting message

Social Networking

- I can make decisions about what information and which pictures I should use on social networking sites
- I know who will be able to see the information I put on social networking sites
- I consider how what I publish can affect the feelings of other people
- I can make informed decision about who to make links with on social networking sites

E-Mail

- I can make informed decisions about who to give my e-mail address to
- I know what to do if I receive an e-mail that upsets or worries me
- I can make judgements about where e-mails have been sent from

Mobile Phones / Texting

- I can make informed decisions about who to give my mobile number to
- I understand the effect my messages could have on others
- I know what to do if I receive a text that worries or upsets me
- I can make judgements about the potential costs of sending messages
- I understand that texts and pictures I send can be passed on to other people.

Key Points for Thought and Discussion

Strategies for children:

- Who wrote the materials on this site?
- Is the information likely to be accurate?
- Who can edit the site?
- Is the site appropriate for someone my age?
- If I interact with others on the site, do I know who they really are?
- What personal information should I not give out on the site?
- If the site asks me to install something, how do I know it is safe?

What if things go wrong?

- Speak to an adult straight away.
- Use the back button straight away on the internet.

Instant Messaging

- Do I know the person I am adding to my buddy list?
- How do I know they are who they say they are?
- How will my messages make other people feel?
- Messages could be being saved by the person you are chatting to.

Social Networking

- What information should I give about myself on the internet?
- Which pictures should I use of myself?
- When I write something online - who else can see it?
- How will what I write make other people feel?
- How do I know the real identity of my online friends?

E-Mail

- Who should I give my e-mail address to?
- If I create an e-mail address, I should just use my first name or a nickname.
- How do I know where e-mails have come from?
- What is phishing?

Passwords

- Who needs to know my password?
- Why should I keep it safe?

Mobile Phones / Texting

- Who do I want to know my mobile number?
- How will my text make other people feel?
- Who should I send pictures to? (MMS)
- How do I know how much it will cost when I send a message?
- What about ordering ringtones / wallpapers?
